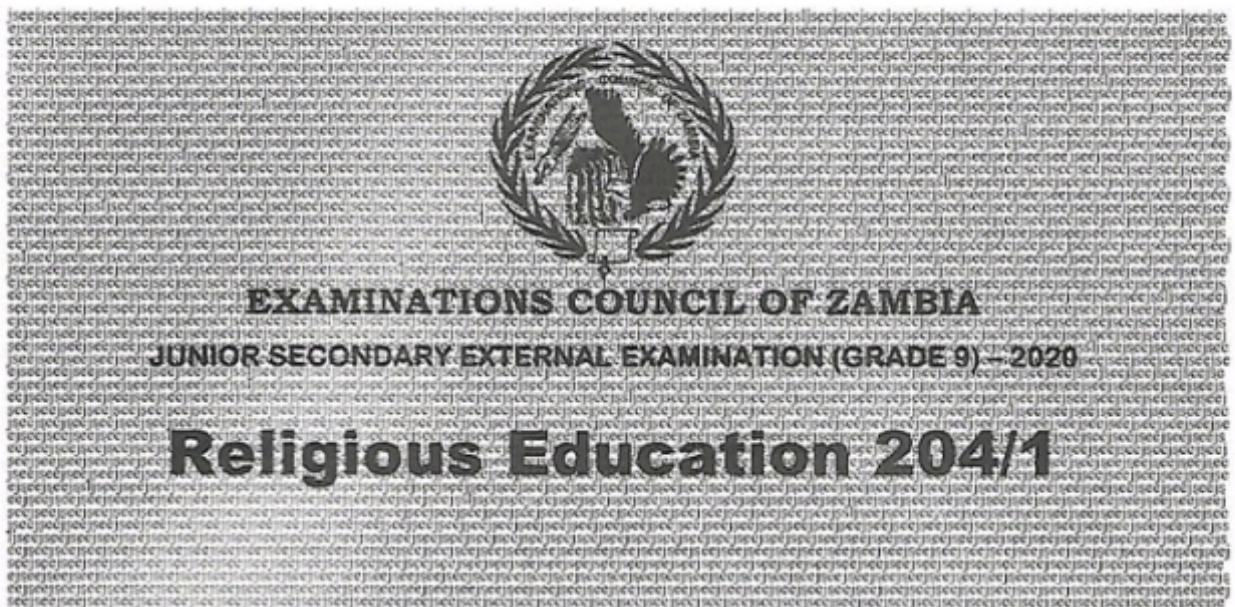

40 Learning and Truth

Mulonga was born in the rural parts of the country. The village was situated on the plateau overlooking a great river which meanders between hills. As Mulonga stood on the verandah of her parents' house, she could see canoes on the river and men busy fishing. One could spend hours and hours admiring this beautiful scenery.

Every morning and evening, people went to the river to bath and wash their clothes and kitchen utensils. Women and girls bathed a good distance away from the men and the boys. There was strict observance of the norms and culture.

In the evenings, Mulonga and her young brothers and sisters would sit around the fire place and listened very attentively to folk stories. The grandmother told them nice stories about the hare and other animals.

One day, some people came to the village with strange machines. They started announcing using the strange machines which sounded more than a normal human voice. The message was that they would show the film that evening and they were inviting all the villagers to come and watch. Mulonga and all other villagers looked forward to that event. Even the day seemed to be longer than usual.

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Eventually, evening came and the men started assembling their equipment. In front, they put something which looked like a big white cloth and two big boxes. Then, they put another equipment and mounted it with two wheels. One of the wheels was filled with something that looked like a plastic. The wheels started rotating and there were letters and then people appearing on the white cloth which was in front. This was the first time the villagers had watched the film.

The film was entitled 'Grace land', based on the western life style. Mulonga watched how the women were living in one big house. The owner, who was also a woman, used to welcome different male strangers in the hotel. The women then would be called into one big room and then the men would choose whoever they want and went away to have sex with them.

The film ended by two inmate women who rebelled against this practice and the government came and closed the hotel.

The villagers dispersed after the end of the film. Mulonga felt very low esteemed that evening. She couldn't imagine that as a woman, she was just a sex object to men. The men's behaviours were abusive towards the women. She was so hurt that she decided to go and consult her teacher.

The following day, Mulonga went to school and asked her teacher about the film the villagers and herself had watched the previous evening.

Mulonga: "Excuse me, Madam Malowe, did you also watch that horrible film? Is it true that men can do such things to women?"

Ms Malowe: "Yes, I did. What you saw last evening can be described in two ways , First, the film was based on a fictitious story, though the story could be true in life. What I mean is that such kind of a thing can happen in life where people are greedy for money and men who have got lust for sex. The second way of looking at it, is that the films were made for entertainment and all those things never happen in real life. The actors and actresses are responsible people and some of them are married with loving husbands and wives."

Mulonga: "Madam, are you telling us that all that we saw yesterday evening was not true?"

Ms Malowe: "All that you saw was fiction and you are not supposed to initiate that. We should always uphold our norms and culture."
